CHANTIERS JEUNESSE IN A FEW WORDS...

History

Chantiers jeunesse (CJ) is a non-profit organization born in 1980. At first created as a local organization for volunteers from Québec on projects in Québec, we quickly developed international exchanges with French and Belgian organizations. These two countries remained our only international partners throughout the 1980s. However, since 1992, Chantiers jeunesse has gradually increased its international activities and diversified its number of partner organizations in order to widen its global scope. Today, we co-operate with 50 organizations spread in several different countries. Each year, we send approximately 20 to 50 volunteers outside Canada and welcome around 30 volunteers from abroad and here on our projects.

Mission

Chantiers jeunesse is a non-profit and non-governmental organization whose goals are to enhance young citizens' social involvement and motivation, to support community development and to help people reach their full potential. We work with partners from various backgrounds to offer learning and training opportunities based on solidarity and respect of diversity.

In addition to fulfilling these goals, the international exchange program also aims to spread social awareness as well as intercultural communication and understanding between people from different countries and cultures.

Activities

Chantiers jeunesse organizes voluntary work projects in Canada.

- We organize intercultural cooperative volunteer camp in Canada. Each group consists of a fifteen young individuals (10 from Canada and 5 from many countries of Europe, Eastern Europe, North America and Asia).
- We send volunteers from Canada, aged 15 to 30 years old, on international volunteer camps abroad in over 35 different countries.
- Individual projects.
- *We send MTVs abroad (in our partners' office or in local communities)
- *We host each year MTVs, co-leader, on volunteer camps here in Canada.

INTERCULTURAL COOPERATIVE VOLUNTEER CAMP

The duration of these projects is usually 2-3 weeks and they take place in various regions of Quebec Province. Generally speaking, each group counts 15 volunteers (10 Canadians and 5 from abroad) and 2 group leaders.

Work

The volunteers work an average of 25 (for the 15-17 years old) and 30 hours (for the 18 years old and older) a week. Work is usually manual: environmental protection, construction, renovation, historical preservation, technical support for popular festivals, etc. No particular skills are required.

Accommodation, food, leisure

Lodging and food are provided for all volunteers. A small budget is allowed for the discovery of the surroundings, and a minibus is available during parts of the volunteer camp. The type of accommodation varies from cottages, little houses or community centers. Volunteers must sometimes prepare their own meals.

Educational approach

Chantiers jeunesse promotes participatory and democratic management as an approach to stimulate volunteers to take responsibilities and become self-reliant through experimentation, success and partnership. The volunteers have to be involved in the camp life by taking responsibilities such as the work and schedule planning, the organization of activities, etc. The group members manage the budget together, with help of the group leaders. Contact and activities with the local community are strongly promoted.

Group leaders

There are 1 or 2 group leaders on each project. Their role is to help volunteers take initiative and responsibility. They are the main contacts and they make sure the volunteer camp runs smoothly. The presence of a technical "expert" is left to the responsibility of the local organization.

Age limit

Our projects are open to volunteers of 15 years old and older.

Camp languages

The camp languages are both English and French, the official languages of Canada, allophone are welcome.

Insurance

Chantiers jeunesse provides a liability insurance for volunteers during the volunteer camp. However, foreign citizens who seek medical attention in Canada are required to pay. For example, a simple consultation with a physician can cost up to \$800CAN (approx. 500 euros). For this reason, **the volunteers MUST have a valid medical insurance** for the complete duration of the project.

Travel Documents

There are four (4) documents that you may need to come to Canada and our Volunteer camps.

1-A work permit

A work permit allows you to work in Canada. Our volunteer camps are considered to be "work" by the Canadian government. This means you need this document to participate in our camps. Unless you have Canadian citizenship, permanent residence or already have a valid permit allowing you to work in Canada, you will need this document. If you think that you don't need the work permit, please contact us so we can verify.

The first step is sending us a copy of the photo page of your passport through your national volunteer camp organization. We will then send you all the information on how to proceed.

2-A visa

A visa is a piece of paper that authorizes you to enter Canada. Most European countries have agreements with Canada and their citizens do not need to get a visa for stays less than 6 months.

If you do need a visa, it will be delivered with the work permit.

3-An electronic travel authorization (eTA)

Any non-Canadian citizen travelling to Canada by air needs to get an eTA. This is a new requirement. It cost \$7CAN (less than €5)

4-Biometrics

The majority of people travelling in Canada must now give their biometrics before they come.

Infosheet

4 weeks before the volunteer camps, volunteers will receive an infosheet with all the logistical details and contact details, such as the facilitator. It will also be an opportunity for them to ask their question.

The day before the beginning of the project

For Summer projects, just before the departure to the volunteer camps, there will be a "4 à 7" (a happy hour) gathering volunteers and some people from Chantiers jeunesse in a relaxed and informal atmosphere, starting at 4:00 PM, in a "cool" little pub of Montreal.

Please, inform your volunteers about this "4 à 7" before they buy their plane ticket !

The day of the volunteer camp

For volunteer camps in remote areas: transportation by minibus to the site is organized and paid by Chantiers jeunesse.

For volunteer camps in the greater Montreal area, volunteers will leave the city together by public transport to the site, in this case the transportation ticket is their responsibility.

All transport details will be provided in the infosheet.

LOCAL ORGANIZATION: The [Héritage Kinnear's Mills](#) society's missions are to showcase the Kinnear's Mills Village's historic site and to honour the rich cultural heritage that their founders left behind them. WORK

The Héritage Kinnear's Mills society needs volunteers to restore old buildings and promote tourism development. LOCAL ORGANIZATION: The Outdoor [Centre de plein air le Saisonnier](#) provides a memorable experience in an enchanting setting for everyone. WORK


